CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

JEFFERSON COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS Regular Session August 16, 2016

The Board met this date in regular session. Present were Chairman Stephen Walker, Commissioners Betsy Barfield, Benjamin "Benny" Bishop, Hines Boyd and Gene Hall. Also present were County Attorney Buck Bird, County Coordinator Parrish Barwick and Chief Deputy Clerk Tyler McNeill.

- 1. Commissioner Bishop led the invocation and pledge of allegiance.
- 2. Commissioner Barfield, the Board's appointee to the Capital Region Transportation Planning Agency, introduced Greg Slay as the new executive director of the CRTPA.
- 3. Commissioner Barfield requested that Marcia Elder with Small Business Development be added as item 5(b) under general business. On motion by Commissioner Barfield, seconded by Commissioner Hall and unanimously carried, the agenda was amended to include Marcia Elder as item 5(b).
- 4. On motion by Commissioner Barfield, seconded by Commissioner Bishop and unanimously carried, the consent agenda—consisting of the approval of the agenda as amended and the minutes of the July 19th, 2016 and August 2nd, 2016 Regular Sessions—was approved.
- 5. Citizen Amy Datz of Tallahassee addressed the Board on mineral rights and requested the Board approve an ordinance banning fracking. Citizen Bill Segis acknowledged and thanked the Board for their resolution against fracking and spoke in support of an ordinance. Citizen Paul Henry warned against any ordinance that contradicts state law. Citizen Jerry Sutphin commented on the impact an ordinance could have.
- 6. Citizen Charles Parrish asked if referendum on the sports complex would be binding and if Commissioners would honor wishes of the voters. Citizen Steven Webster provided comments on the Game Changer project.
- 7. Citizen Fred Williams commented on fracking.
- 8. Alex Quintana with Congresswoman Gwen Graham's Office informed the Board of a Military Academy Day to be held on August 25th from 5-8 pm in Tallahassee for any prospective candidates interested in attending a service academy.
- 9. Aucilla Regional Landfill Director John McHugh and Engineer Frank Darabi presented a check in the amount of \$75,103.38 to the Board. Citizen Paul Henry urged the Board to give the money back to the Solid Waste users.
- 10. Marcia Elder with Small Business Development addressed the Board on some final items for her transition out of the county in this capacity. Commissioner Bishop stated the Clerk of Court's Office handled records retention and storage on a daily basis and may have extra space, to which Chief Deputy Clerk Tyler

McNeill stated he could house the four boxes and computer at the Courthouse behind lock and key rather than the County renting a storage unit.

- 11. County Attorney Buck Bird stated he was in the process of working with the School Board's attorney on paying the plaintiffs costs/fees on the redistricting lawsuit. He stated the first installment had been paid by the county, but the second installment (due in October) was the responsibility of the School Board.
- 12. Commissioner Hall commented that the Industrial Park looked really good. Commissioner Barfield requested a copy of the finalized lease agreement for Glen Bishop Enterprises.
- 13. Commissioner Hall requested he be considered an alternate for the CRTPA. Commissioner Barfield stated the alternate was currently Chairman Walker but if he did not object, the change could be placed on the next agenda to be addressed.
- 14. Commissioner Hall commented that the sidewalks on Mamie Scott Drive looked really good.
- 15. Commissioner Barfield requested that auditor Chris Johnson, with Carr Riggs and Ingram, attend a future meeting to present the Audited Financial Report to the Board.
- 16. Commissioner Barfield inquired about the budget, to which Finance Director Charles Culp stated the Tentative Budget Hearing was scheduled for September 12th with the Final Budget Hearing scheduled for September 27th. Commissioner Barfield also inquired about the possibility of having the budget placed on the County website.
- 17. The warrant register was reviewed and bills ordered paid.
- 18. On motion by Commissioner Bishop, seconded by Commissioner Barfield and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.

2017 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

Commissioners, It is that time again for you to consider fiscal priorities for the 2017 Legislative Session which begins on March 6^{th} . As you know, much of the budgeting is done prior to the end of this year, and the finalizing is done during the March/April Session. The Legislative Committee meets with Senator Montford and Representative Beshears in November and December, informing them of your priorities and seeking their early support. To help us, we publish the informative Annual Yearbook which contains those priorities. Dealing with time constraints, it would be most helpful if you could have your priorities determined by the October 4 BOCC meeting.

Following are 2016 Priorities that might help you in your deliberations.

SPORTS COMPLEX REFERENDUM RESULTS

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-05072016-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF JEFFERSON COUNTY, FLORIDA, SETTING A REFERENDUM OF **OUALIFIED ELECTORS CONCERNING** THE GAME CHANGER PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR **FINDINGS: PROVIDING FOR REFERENDUM:** PROVIDING FOR DESCRIPTION OF **PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR FORM** OF **BALLOT; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION** OF **NOTICE:** PROVIDING FOR **CANVASSING OF RETURNS; PROVIDING** FOR SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR INTENT AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners Jefferson County, Florida, is deciding whether to participate in a public/private partnership to facilitate the acquisition and construction of a proposed sports facility at the intersection interchange of State Highway 59 and Interstate 10 within Jefferson County; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it ADOPTED AND RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Jefferson County, Florida, as follows:

SECTION 1. Findings. The findings of the Board of County Commissioners set forth in the foregoing recitals are hereby adopted.

SECTION 2. Referendum. A referendum election of the qualified electors of Jefferson County, Florida, concerning whether or not Jefferson County should participate in the acquisition and construction of the Game Changer Project is hereby set for August 30, 2016, to be conducted together with the regular state and County primary election.

SECTION 3. Description of Project. Jefferson County, Florida, has been offered the opportunity to participate in a public/private partnership for acquisition and construction of a proposed sports facility at the intersection interchange of State Highway 59 and Interstate 10 within Jefferson County. The facility, commonly referred to as the "Game Changer Project," would be a sports tourism facility serving as an event destination for regional tournaments and local sports events. The project is expected to consist of a 100,000 square foot dome structure connected to a 16,000 square foot building with restrooms, meeting rooms, a restaurant, offices, storage rooms and other support space. The dome will include basketball and volley ball courts, a baseball practice field, training areas, a fitness/workout area, and an active entertainment area. There will also be an adjacent

20,000 square foot covered turf field for soccer and lacrosse. The expected programming for the complex will be designed to generate revenue from both regional (sports tourism-based) events and local activities including venues for local games, sports and fitness training, and recreation activities.

The actual construction of the project will occur only after an acceptable lease/purchase arrangement has been negotiated, which must contain such terms and conditions as are acceptable to the Board of County Commissioners. It is anticipated that a number of additional agreements will be required in order to undertake the project, including, but not limited to, a land donation agreement, and agreements associated with grants that the County intends to apply for to fund additional infrastructure.

SECTION 4. Form of Ballot. The ballot question for this referendum shall be substantially in the following form:

Should Jefferson County participate in a public/private partnership for the acquisition, construction and operation of a multi-purpose sports complex to be located at the Lloyd (SR 59/I-10) Interchange to be funded by no more than a \$10,000,000.00 thirty (30) year lease/purchase arrangement with annual payments to be made by the County as lessee in an amount necessary to repay the cost of construction, with interest, and to fund a reserve account to cover operating losses?

SECTION 5. Polling Locations and Ballots by Mail. The polling locations or places shall be determined by the Supervisor of Elections of Jefferson County, Florida, and all qualified electors of the County who vote in said election shall vote at said designated polling places. Ballots by Mail as provided by law are also expressly authorized and shall constitute an exception to the above stated polling place requirement.

SECTION 6. Notice. The Clerk of Circuit Court shall provide notice of the referendum by causing publication of the Notice of Referendum attached hereto as Exhibit "A" in a newspaper of general circulation in Jefferson County at least twice, the first such notice to be published not later than thirty (30) days before the referendum and the second notice to be published not later than fifteen (15) days before the referendum.

SECTION 7. Canvassing of Returns. The returns of this referendum shall be canvassed in the manner provided by law, and said returns shall be certified to the Board of County Commissioners, which shall declare the results thereof.

SECTION 8. Savings Clause. In the event that any word, phrase, clause, sentence or paragraph hereof shall be held invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other word, clause, sentence or paragraph hereof.

SECTION 9. Intent. It is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners to enter into a lease/purchase arrangement for the Game Changer Project as described herein only if a majority of qualified electors voting in the referendum election set hereby vote in the affirmative concerning the ballot question in Section 4 hereof, and, as such, it is the intent of the Board to treat as binding the results of such referendum election.

SECTION 10. Effective Date. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

NOTICE OF REFERENDUM – GAME CHANGER PROJECT AUGUST 30, 2016

JEFFERSON COUNTY, FLORIDA

To be held Tuesday, August 30, 2016, as provided by Resolution No. 2016-05072016-01 of the Jefferson County Board of County Commissioners, as governing body of Jefferson County, Florida, adopted on July 5th, 2016.

Notice is hereby given that a referendum election of the qualified electors of Jefferson County, Florida, has been set for August 30, 2016, to be conducted together with the regular state and County primary election. The referendum concerns whether or not Jefferson County should participate in the acquisition and construction of the Game Changer Project. It is the intent of the Board of County Commissioners that the County be bound by the results of the referendum.

The referendum will assist the Board of County Commissioners in determining whether to participate in a public/private partnership for acquisition and construction of a proposed sports facility at the intersection interchange of State Highway 59 and Interstate 10 within Jefferson County. The facility, commonly referred to as the "Game Changer Project," would be a sports tourism facility serving as an event destination for regional tournaments and local sports events.

The facility is anticipated to be constructed at a cost of approximately \$10,000,000.00. The County would enter into a long term lease/purchase of the facility for a period of thirty (30) years at an annual lease payment as is necessary to repay the initial cost of construction with interest, together with a reserve to fund operating costs of the facility for the lease term. Pursuant to the terms of the lease/purchase agreement, the County may in any year elect not to appropriate funds to make the lease payment, whereupon it would agree to release its rights in the facility to the lessor and would not be further obligated. The facility would be operated by a private entity and a revenue sharing arrangement would provide a portion of the facility user fee revenues to the County. The County would be responsible for any operating losses. It is anticipated, but not guaranteed, that the lease payment from the County will be offset by facility user fee revenues and additional tax revenues generated by new additional development at the interchange including an eighty-eight (88) room hotel and travel center with restaurants.

Three workshops will be held at dates and times to be announced and published in the newspaper.

All qualified electors of Jefferson County shall be entitled to vote in the referendum.
